When Bailee applied for a Member Service Representative position at Crane Credit Union, she was looking for a job that felt steady and offered the balance she needed to raise a family. What she didn't know was decades earlier, her great-grandmother had sat behind a similar counter, building relationships in the very institution Bailee was about to join.

Bailee's great-grandmother, Edith Baker, worked at Crane U.S. Naval Depot Employees Federal Credit Union from 1972 to 1990. A mother of nine, Edith held many jobs throughout her life, but of all those positions, the credit union was by far her favorite.

Bailee and her Grandpa Don sat down with us to talk about Edith's time at Crane Credit Union and to reflect on the tradition Bailee is now continuing. When asked what it means to follow in her family's footsteps, Bailee shared, "It's so fun to be following in her legacy."

Of all the memories the family has preserved of Edith, Don notes the credit union was a huge part of her life. During a time when she had lost her husband and still had children at home to care for, Crane Credit Union welcomed her, helped guide her towards retirement, and gave her a sense of community. "They were as good to her as she was to them," Don said.

We are so honored to be part of stories like these. Seeing one family's legacy come full circle, from Edith's teller window decades ago to Bailee's today, is a powerful reminder of our mission and the people we serve.
